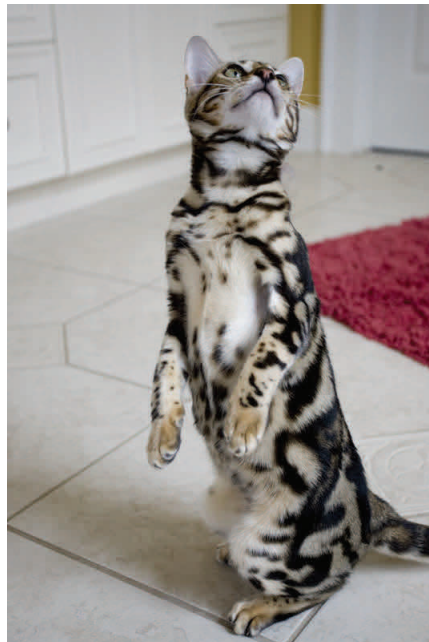


Our Goals

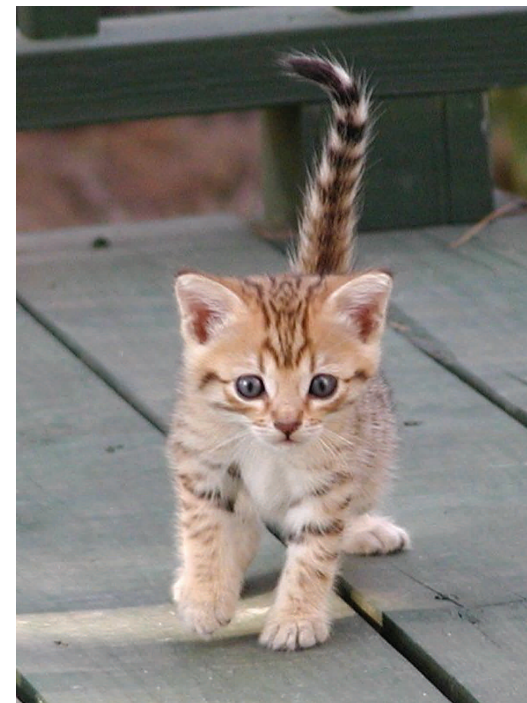

In the last 3 years, some of the many things TIBCS has accomplished for Bengals are:

- Negotiated CITES requirements with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service for easier import/export of Bengals
- Funded Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy (HCM) research at Washington State University
- Funded research in Early PRA in Bengals at UC Davis
- Started the Heritage Conservation Fund to protect wild ALCs in their natural environments
- Granted \$\$ to Bengal rescues
- Continued to protect the Bengal Breed through legal education
- Provided free listings to help members place retired breeders
